With reference to above, the undersigned is directed to inform that recognition of the Karuna Wildlife Rescue Centre, Enumanapalli, Andhra Pradesh under Section 38-H of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972, was valid till 30th June, 2017. Application for renewal of recognition was received in this office vide e-mail dated 22th May, 2020 from your end. Dr. Devender Kumar, Evaluation and Monitoring Officer, Central Zoo Authority was deputed by this office has evaluated the zoo on 15th&16th July, 2021. Copy of the Evaluation Report is enclosed herewith for your perusal and needful action.

2. Evaluation Report of the Karuna Wildlife Rescue Centre, Enumanapalli was considered by the 38th Meeting of the Central Zoo Authority held on 16th November, 2020, in exercise of powers conferred under sub-section (1), (3) and (4) of Section 38-H under the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972, considered the evaluation report.

The Central Zoo Authority has regularised the period after 30th June, 2017 and renewed recognition of the Karuna Wildlife Rescue Centre, Enumanapalli, Andhra Pradesh as a Rescue Centre for a period up to 15th November, 2023 subject to compliance with following conditions as per the Recognition of Zoo Rules, 2009 (RZR) and mid-term evaluation of the zoo:
