## INTRODUCTION

“Construction” is the most important word to qualify the year 2006-07 for Karuna.

As we received the first installment grant for the construction of “Shelter house for Animals” in 2006, we started the construction of shelter for our rescued cattle and a hospital for cattle. The cattle’s shed is located at Karunapalli beyond Rayalavaripalli village.



At the hospital in Enumulapalli an outpatient department was constructed with 4 kennels and at the other side of the wall inpatient cattle shed and one more big cattle shed. The foundation for the cattle hospital was started. But the hospital was finalized due to too much work at other places.

A new activity was the support we gave to a friend in Tiruvannamalai where we opened a Karuna branch in January 2007.

Thanks to donations from Holland we started the construction of an ABC double operation Theatre, which will be completed in 2007-08.



## Karuna Small Animals Hospital

As usual we have many disabled animals in our clinic. Karuna is their home.

Treatment of inpatients is still free of charge and many stray dogs and owners dogs are treated for accidents, parvo virus, distemper and skin problems.



For distemper approximately 60% of the animals recover after intensive care for several weeks or even months, some of them stay disabled and live at Karuna.

Accident cases with big wounds are treated best with bandages of colloidal silver (Natural antibiotic); fractures are fixed with a combination of green clay bandage and splints. We have become very experienced with these alternative methods.



- Treatments: This year we treated 2979 small animals. This includes Parvo, Rabid, Distemper, accident cases etc. most of the parvo and Distemper dogs were recovered.
- Yearly twice we receive volunteer Doctors from Holland for service
- Total 621 permanent animals with us under our direct and indirect care.

### Out Patient Department:

On 24.12.2006, Out Patient Department opened for small animals

The opening of the outpatient department was a relief as the treatments are given separate from the inpatients and less infection will be transferred. There is also less barking by the permanent residents!!!



### Income & Expenditure of the small animal clinic

- Clinic and administrative expenses for the year 2006-07 is Rs.14,80,283/-
- General grant received for the maintenance of the clinic is Rs. 1,00,000/- for the year 2006-07

### Karuna ABC & AR Programme:

We completed ABC operations in Dharmavaram and most villages in and around Puttaparthi, who signed a MoU with Karuna. This year we conducted 947 ABC Operations for Dogs and 15 ABC operations for cats in our clinic at Puttaparthi and in our branch at Tiruvannamalai, Tamilnadu. Total AR Vaccinations are 1,613 Nos. to dogs, cats and other animals.



Two times this year we have stopped the ABC program. First, because of an out break of distemper in the area. We could not be sure which animals were already infected and when some animals died after operations from distemper we stopped the program.

### Income and Expenditure for ABC:

Total expenditure on ABC operations is Rs.4,91,812/-

Grant received from AWBI is Rs.3,81,365/- (includes 2005-06) ABC Grant amount of Rs.1,58,865/-)

➤ *ABC Double Operation Theatre*

We started the construction of a separate ABC Operation theatre for Dogs with the financial support from “M/s Dierenbescherming Zutphen, Holland” on 10.12.2006, from which we received Rs.3,51,595/-

The design for the building contains pre-operation room, double operation room, post operative care, doctors room, medicine storage, sterilizing room and dirty room



➤ *Tiruvannamalai Project:*



Mr. Derek O’Neil, M/s Prema Agni Foundation, USA donated Rs.12,17,920/- to Karuna to provide medical facilities to the animals (dogs) in Tiruvannamalai, Tamilnadu. The Tiruvannamalai Municipality provided a old building for development for ABC program and clinic. We converted into a beautiful clinic and constructed some more dog rooms and kitchen.

Two volunteer doctors from Holland started the project after the opening on 10.01.2007.

### Cattle Hospital & Rescue Shelters:

- In the month of August 2006, we have appointed a Vet. Officer for our cattle. We completed the construction of cattle shed with the financial support from AWBI.
- On 8<sup>th</sup> January 2006, we received 35 male buffaloes for safe custody from the Police, Bathalapalli that they rescued from illegal transportation to slaughter. Unfortunately, we were not party in the case and the butchers went to court and got a release order. They came with the police and took away the buffaloes. This case is still pending.



On 29.09.2006, we rescued 41 cattle from Illegal transport to Slaughter near by Gorantla and 20 cattle given to M/s International Animal & Birds Welfare Society, Guttur for caretaking. Out two societies participated in the rescue operation.

We received 18 cattle rescued by Rayadurg Police from Illegal Transportation for slaughter house.



On 15.10.2006, we received 21 cattle received from Gooty Police, rescued by Cine Artist Mr. Naresh nearby Gooty and handed over to them. Most of them died after several weeks of treatment due to internal injuries from transport.

The construction of KP Cattle shed was completed and on 29<sup>th</sup> October 2006 started the using for cattle.



AWBI sanctioned Drought Relief grant of Rs.7,00,000/- but grant was received in the 2007-08 financial year. We started procuring dry grass, concentrated feed and etc.



### Rescue of Camel:

We rescued a Camel from Slaughter on 16.02.2007 in Kadiri Town near by our place. It was brought from Rajasthan for slaughter. It was being paraded round the town with a banner mentioning the price of its meat.



*Attempt to Murder on our President:*

On the 13<sup>th</sup> October 2006, our President, Vet. Doctor, Treasurer and 3 assistants went to Gorantla to conduct a medical camp and to spread awareness about cattle among farmers came there to sell off their cattle. Within 5 minutes, we were attacked by an organized mob. They targeted our president Mrs. Clementien A Pauws. She was escaped with mild injuries and our vehicles were completely damaged.



All the local news papers covered this incident and so many people condemned the incident. Some organizations staged a Dharna in Gorantla against this incident.

On our leased land we produced organic Rice for our Dogs food and grass for cattle.

We are still looking after the deer peacocks, painted storks and monkeys. Many birds and other small wild animals have been treated and released. We are waiting for the Recognition from CZA for Wildlife Rescue Centre.
